Cathedral Squared Enterprises artisan project gathers women from a variety of stories and histories to build authentic relationships while creating functional art out of single-use plastic bags otherwise headed to the landfill. C²E challenges our throw-away culture by empowering people to create a world where no one and nothing is seen as disposable. Ways to support C²E:

1) Donate your plastic bags - better yet, join us Mon-Thurs 1-4 PM to learn how to make plarn (plastic yarn).

2) Donate sewing machines and sewing equipment - our artisans have received a donation of fabric and would like to make cloth grocery bags to help our plastic bag donors end their dependence on single-use plastic bags.

3) Be a crochet coach - working one on one with our artisans Monday - Thursday from 1 PM - 4 PM at the Cathedral to help our artisans perfect the art of crochet!
