reconciliation and the healing of racism in our community. The Friday following the events of Charlottesville in late August, Fr. Tim Kitzke called for a special prayer experience to honor the lives lost and those injured during that event. More than 250 people attended that service and since then, a regular group of 35-40 people have been joining weekly in the Cathedral for prayer the first step we can make to truly heal ourselves and our world from the deep wounds we all feel due to racism.
